Payments

Payments must accompany the registration form. Payments are accepted by cash, check, money order, VISA or MasterCard. On-line registration for workshops requiring a fee can only be accomplished with VISA or MasterCard.

Deadlines

Deadline dates are listed with individual courses. These dates reflect the time needed to make sure the supplies and materials are available for all participants. Courses such as First Aid will accept registration after the deadline date if the maximum has not been met. **There is a \$5.00 late fee attached to registrations accepted after the deadline date.**

Cancellation Policy

Please contact the Jacksonville Service Center to cancel if you are unable to attend training. The Activity Registrar accepts cancellations in writing until the day of registration. Those classes that required a fee will be refunded if cancellation is received in writing before the last day of registration. Cancellations made after the last registration date are not eligible for a refund.

Refunds

Full refunds are made up to and including the last day of registration except where a non-refundable fee is specified. Credit vouchers will be given for amounts under \$10.00 and the vouchers may be used to register for future events or towards purchases in the Council Shop.

Girl Scout Junior Transition

Specifically for leaders, co-leaders and assistant leaders that are moving to the Girl Scout Junior level. Learn about Troop Government, resources, and awards for Girl Scout Juniors.

Prerequisite: Leadership Essentials and Troop Pathways and one year experience working with girls.

Girl Scout Cadette/Senior/Ambassador Transition

Specifically for leaders, co-leaders and assistant leaders that are moving to the Cadette/Senior/Ambassador level. Explore resources, forms of government and awards for Girl Scout Cadette, Senior and Ambassador.

Prerequisite: Leadership Essentials and Troop Pathways and one year experience working with girls.

Zip Mentor Training

Zip Girl Scouting is a program opportunity for girls who are not connected to a troop. Girls work with a mentor on recognitions, handbook activities, bridging, leadership awards, etc. Girls may attend service unit and council events and may participate in product sale programs.

Mentors are parents or other adults who guide the girls as they explore opportunities and plan activities. Zip Fees (\$15.00) are used to provide recognitions and quarterly mailings.

Training covers basic policies and procedures, identification of resources, product sale opportunities, bridging and finding a troop when ready.



Taking Trips with Girls

Archery Instructor Training (Level I)

Hands-on activities that encourage campers to experience the darkness, sounds and sights (YES! sights at night!) of camp in an active way without a flashlight. It's fun for all ages! Participants must be Girl Scout Seniors/Ambassadors or adults; this is an enrichment course and does not provide certification.

ACA Essentials of Kayak Touring

Explore Lake McCarthy by kayak—no experience required! Learn the basics of recreational flat water kayak paddling including strokes, games, group safety and rescue skills. Successful completion of this class enables participants to facilitate kayak activities* at Camp Kateri and participants receive an ACA Essentials of Kayak Touring skills card. Participants must be at least 18 years old.

Gateway Canoe Course

Explore Hankley Lake by canoe—no experience required! Learn the basics of recreational flat water canoeing including strokes, games, group safety, and rescue skills. Successful completion of this class enables participants to facilitate canoe activities* at Camp Kateri; this is a GSGC certification course, not a national certification. Participants must be at least 18 years old.

*Per GSGC standards all watercraft activities require at least two adults. One adult must be trained in the small craft being utilized and the second must be a lifeguard. For more information please see the VRG and Safety Wise.

This training does not provide an external certification, but successful completion does provide the knowledge and experience to operate the Camp Kateri and Camp Seminole Springs kitchens. Participants must be at least 18 years old.

Astronomy

Experience the night sky and explore a whole new world! Participants will spend time in the classroom as well as have night time telescope observation time. Learn hands-on activities to understand the night sky, solar system and universe and all the celestial bodies that make it up! Participants must be Girl Scout Seniors/Ambassadors or adults; this training does not provide certification; however it trains participants in proper telescope care and use and enables ONLY these participants to reserve Camp Kateri and Camp North Fork Ranch telescopes.

The Basic Outdoor Skills—Hands On

This is a national program and is facilitated locally by the Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission. Participants must be at least 18 years old and will receive books to take home of the materials taught in the class.

Project Florida Black Bear

A how-to training full of fun with hands-on age specific activities for grades 3-8 about the natural history and conversation needs of Florida's black bear. These activities have outdoor, indoor, educational, and FUN components to help campers understand the needs and benefits of Florida's inhabitants. This is program is linked to the Project Wild program and is facilitated locally by the Florida Fish & Wildlife and the Defenders of Wildlife. Participants must be at least 18 years old.

Sing Out Loud

Learn crazy and fun camp songs to share with your campers! Action songs, repeat after me songs, crazy songs, songs that make no sense, songs that campers will sing over, and over, and over, and over and over again! Learn them all! Be sure to bring your tape recorder to assist in remembering the tunes and words. Participants must be Girl Scout Seniors/Ambassadors or adults; this is enrichment training and does not provide certification.
